

Yonkers School-Based Family Peer Advocate

POSITION SUMMARY:

Family peer support services are an array of services and supports provided to families raising a child or young adult up to age 21, who is experiencing social, emotional, developmental and/or behavioral health challenges. These services are community-based and are provided in a variety of settings that meet a family's needs and schedule.

The Family Peer Advocate functions as both an advocate and deliverer of services that are traumainformed and designed to support caregivers in achieving and sustaining their family's good health, emotional wellness and stability.

The Family Peer Advocate (FPA) will work as a member of a team, and in close collaboration, with a clinical case manager and respite specialist to support caregivers of youngsters who are referred to the Yonkers school-based Crisis Stabilization Program, an innovative short-term intervention designed to help students avoid hospitalization and/or emergency room visits.

Full-time, some nights and weekends may be required.

Salary range: \$34,000 - \$45,000, depending on experience.

RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- Establish structured, strength-based, supportive relationships with caregivers that benefit the youth/child.
- Participate in weekly Crisis team meetings;
- Contribute a family support lens to the safety planning process and the overall crisis stabilization plan;
- Link and refer to Family Ties' Yonkers Resource Center;
- Meet families in the office, at home or in the community as requested;
- Assist families in identifying their strengths, challenges and goals;
- Connect families to needed resources and supports;
- Promote effective parent-professional partnerships and address barriers that may prevent their participation;
- Using an electronic database, document demographic data on all individuals seen, track all services provided to caregivers and monitor progress towards identified goals;
- Support and encourage family participation in community, regional, and state-wide activities to expand leadership skills;
- Coordinate with community partners to ensure cross-systems collaboration on behalf of families served;
- Advocate for services and systems that are fair, responsive, and family-driven;
- Complete all documentation in compliance with agency policy and funding regulations in a timely fashion. This includes, but is not limited to case records, time sheets, mileage forms and expense reports;



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Participate in all agency quality improvement activities.

MUST-HAVE:

- High school diploma or equivalent and two years' experience working directly with families.
- Be a caregiver of a youngster with social, emotional or behavioral challenges.
- Ability to communicate effectively in Spanish (speaking and writing).
- Good verbal, written and computer skills.
- Be able to complete the Family Peer Advocate certification process within one year of hire.
- Valid NYS driver's license, safe driving history, access to a vehicle that is properly insured and registered in accordance with NYS DMV regulations.
- Satisfactory clearances from the Child Abuse Registry and Criminal History Information Tracking System.
- Ability to work with diverse social, cultural, and economic groups.
- Proof of COVID-19 vaccination.

WOULD BE GREAT TO HAVE:

- Familiarity with the Westchester community that we serve.
- Experience facilitating groups.
- Experience providing Wraparound supports.
- Experience using an electronic health record.
- Knowledge of System of Care philosophy.
- Understanding of, and appreciation for, trauma-informed care principles.
- Bachelor's degree.
